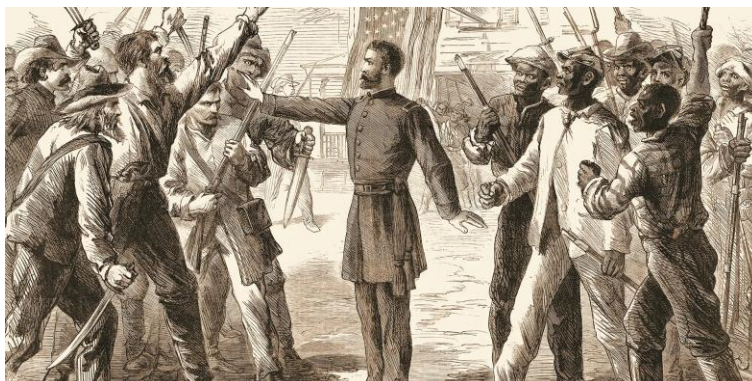


Freedmen's Bureau Records More Valuable to Anyone's Southern Research Than You Might Have Thought

The impact of the Civil War was keenly felt by many living from DE to TX. The Freedmen's Bureau Records are full of pertinent records; not just the records of freed slaves – they include records of ex-soldiers, currently serving soldiers, impoverished widows (of which there were many), small children, immigrants, and old/lame/destitute/poor parents. They include ration, school, court, marriage, military, transportation, hospital, and more records, along with incredibly personal correspondence regarding loved ones. These records are invaluable to ALL researching southern ancestors in the immediate post-Civil War period.
